13 **TENTATIVE RULING**

14 Having read and considered the pleadings, declarations, and other evidence submitted in this matter, the
15 Court makes the following findings and orders:

- 16 1) The parties were ordered to attend mediation with FCS mediator Catherine Gerace for the specific
17 purpose of creating a 2-2-3 timeshare agreement as well as:
18 a. Exchange locations and times
19 b. Notice period about changes in schedules
20 c. Holiday schedule
21 2) The parties attended mediation did not come to an agreement.
22 3) The Court maintains the December 19, 2023 order awarding the parties joint legal and joint physical
23 50/50 custody.
24 4) The Court finds it is in the best interest of Milo for the parties' timeshare to be on a 2-2-3 schedule
25 beginning Friday April 19, 2024:
26 a. Father shall have the 1st and 3rd and 5th weekends of the month, beginning Friday afterschool
27 pick up until Sunday 5:00PM
28 b. Father's shall have alternating weekdays from Monday afterschool to Wednesday AM drop
29 off at school

1 c. Mother all other times

2 d. If there is no school, exchanges are the other parent's home, curbside.

3 5) The Court finds it is in the best interest of Milo for the holiday schedule to be as follows:

4 a. Thanksgiving: Father odd years; Mother even years

5 b. Christmas: Father even years; Mother odd years

6 c. New Year's Day: Father odd years; Mother even years

7 d. Father's Day / weekend: Father, coinciding with the timeshare schedule in #4

8 e. Mother's Day / weekend: Mother coinciding with the timeshare schedule in #4

9 6) The Court finds Father's August 1, 2023 Request for Order ("RFO") adjudicated and takes the matter
10 off calendar.

11 7) All prior orders remain in full force and effect.

12 8) The Court will prepare the order.

15 **TENTATIVE RULING**

16 Having read and considered the pleadings, declarations, and other evidence submitted in this matter, the
17 Court makes the following findings and orders:

- 18 1) Respondent (Mother)'s request to set aside the second paragraph entitled "Scheduling" of Attachment
19 2(e) to the FL-341(C) (Children's Holiday Schedule Attachment) set forth in Exhibit B of the
20 Judgment entered on 11/14/2023 is denied. The Court will, however, consider modifying this
21 paragraph.
- 22 2) Mother's request for an additional week of makeup vacation with the minor child in 2024 is granted.
- 23 3) The parties shall return to mediation with FCS Mediator Celia Wang on Wednesday, 5/8/2024 at 1:30
24 PM to reach an agreement regarding: (a) what language, if any, should replace the "Scheduling"
25 paragraph of Attachment 2(e) of the FL-341(C) attached as Exhibit B to the parties' 11/14/2023
26 Judgment and (b) during what dates may Mother have an additional week of makeup vacation with
27 the minor child in 2024. A review hearing is set for Thursday, 6/20/2024 at 9:00 AM in Dept. 404 to
28 make orders regarding these issues if the parties are unable to reach an agreement in mediation. The
29 parties shall file and serve update declarations at least 10 calendar days prior to the next hearing date.

- 1 4) Within 14 days, the parties shall meet and confer through counsel to schedule an appointment to
2 renew the minor child's passport. The parties shall fully cooperate to get the minor child's passport
3 renewed.
- 4 5) Mother shall maintain possession of the minor child's passport initially. Whichever parent last took
5 the minor child on an international trip shall maintain possession of the minor child's passport until
6 consent is provided for the other party to travel internationally with the minor child, at which time
7 possession of the minor child's passport shall switch to the parent who will next travel internationally
8 with the minor child.
- 9 6) The parties shall follow the terms of their Judgment regarding notice and consent from the other party
10 regarding international travel with the minor child.
- 11 7) Both parties' requests for attorney's fees sanctions is denied.
- 12 8) Mother's attorney shall prepare the order.
- 13 9) **Preparation of Order:** If you are directed by the court to prepare the order after hearing – within 10
14 calendar days of the hearing you must either: (a) Serve the proposed order to the other party/counsel
15 for approval, and follow the procedures set forth in CA Rules of Court, Rule 5.125(c), or (b) If the
16 other party did not appear or the matter was uncontested, submit the proposed order after hearing
17 directly to the court. Failure to submit the order after hearing within 10 days may allow the other
18 party to prepare a proposed order and submit it to the court in accordance with CA Rules of Court,

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12 REQUEST FOR ORDER TO MODIFY CHILD SUPPORT AND SPOUSAL SUPPORT

13 **TENTATIVE RULING**

14 **Appearances are required for the status conference (that was previously set at the prior**
15 **3/6/2024 status conference) to set a trial date. The parties may appear in-person, by video, or by**
16 **phone. If a party chooses to appear by video or by phone, that party must abide by the Notice and**
17 **Instructions for Remote Appearances in San Francisco Family Court set forth above.**

18 At the hearing, the Court intends to adopt the following findings and orders.

19 Having read and considered the pleadings, declarations, and other evidence submitted in this matter,
20 the Court makes the following findings and orders:

21 **A. Child and Temporary Spousal Support**

22 1) Procedural History

- 23 a. At the prior 2/15/2024 hearing, the Court ordered Father to pay guideline child support of
24 \$1,075 per month and temporary guideline spousal support of \$2,172 per month for the
25 period 10/15/2023 (when Father's contract position began) through 3/15/2024 (when
26 Father's contract position was originally set to end). The Court set a review hearing for
27 4/16/2024 on the following issues: (a) a Smith / Ostler order for the period 10/15/2023 –
28 3/15/2024, (b) child and spousal support effective 3/16/2024, and (c) whether to subject
29 either party to a seek work order.

- 1 b. On 4/5/2024, Mother filed a Review Hearing Declaration stating that she has a
2 mastectomy scheduled for 4/18/2024 and she will be in recovery and unable to work until
3 6/30/2024 if there are no complications. Mother also says she is no longer receiving
4 disability payments as of the beginning of April 2024. Mother requests: (a) extend the
5 current support order through 3/1/2024 and issue a new support order commencing
6 4/1/2024, (b) set a review hearing on support on 7/2/2024, and (c) order Respondent to
7 pay arrears owed.
- 8 c. On 4/10/2024, Father filed an Update Declaration stating that his current contract has
9 been extended for three more months and is now set to expire in mid-to-late June 2024
10 and that his support inputs have not changed since 2/15/2024. Father asks that the Court
11 order: (a) Mother to provide updated medical records, (b) Mother to provide an updated
12 note from her doctor indicating if her inability to work is related to her cancer treatment
13 and why her doctor has put her off work for 10 weeks, (c) an independent medical
14 examination, (d) enter a seek work order for Mother effective July 1 (or set an evidentiary
15 hearing in the Fall, (e) confirm the San Diego condominium to him so he can refinance
16 the property (or bifurcate this issue and set it for an early trial on the characterization and
17 disposition of this asset).

18 2) Findings and Orders

- 19 a. Support for the Period 3/16/2024 – 6/15/2024
- 20 i. According to the doctor’s note attached as Exhibit A to Mother’s Review
21 Hearing Declaration, Mother has been placed off work by her doctor for the
22 period 4/2/2024 – 6/30/2024. Mother has provided the Court with no explanation
23 for why her disability payments stopped at the end of March 2024, whether she
24 remains eligible for disability payments during this new placement “off work”,
25 whether she has applied for disability payments for this period, and whether any
26 such application remains pending or has been denied. Because Mother has not
27 given the Court this information, the Court finds good cause to maintain the
28 current support order with a reservation over the Court’s jurisdiction to modify
29 the support order retroactive to 3/16/2024 at the next hearing date.

- 1 ii. For the period 3/16/2024 – 6/15/2024, in accordance with the Dissomaster which
2 is attached and incorporated into this order, Father shall pay to Mother \$1,065
3 per month in child support and \$2,152 per month in temporary guideline spousal
4 support for a total of \$3,217 due and owing each month. One-half shall be paid
5 by the 1st and one-half shall be paid by the 15th of each month.
- 6 iii. The inputs into the Dissomaster are the same as the inputs used in the
7 Dissomaster issued at the 2/15/2024 hearing. The support figures are slightly
8 different, however, because the current Dissomaster has been run using the
9 updated Dissomaster version of 2024-1 which has yielded slightly different
10 outputs.
- 11 iv. As the Court may retroactively adjust support effective 3/16/2024 at the next
12 hearing date, the Court will not make a Smith / Ostler order regarding support for
13 the period 3/16/2024 – 6/15/2024 at this time, but will do so at the next hearing
14 date.

15 b. Smith / Ostler Support for the Period 10/15/2023 – 3/15/2024

- 16 i. According to the attachment to Father's 2/5/2024 Income and Expense
17 Declaration, during the period 10/15/2023 (when his contract began) through
18 12/31/2023, Father earned total income of \$40,000. According to Exhibit D of
19 Father's 4/10/2024 Update Declaration, during the period 1/1/2024 – 3/31/2024,
20 Father earned total income of \$51,200. Thus, during the period 10/15/2023 –
21 3/31/2024, Father earned total income of \$91,200. This is \$9,068.50 more than
22 Father would have earned had he earned just base income of \$14,933 per month
23 (which would average out to \$82,131.50 for the period 10/15/2023 – 3/31/2024).
- 24 ii. Because Father has not explained what is the total amount he earned just for the
25 period 10/15/2023 – 3/15/2024 and because the Court is not yet making a Smith /
26 Ostler order for the period 3/16/2024 – 3/31/2024, the Court is unable to finalize
27 a Smith / Ostler order for the period 10/15/2023 – 3/15/2024 and this issue is
28 reserved for the next hearing date.

29 c. Support Arrears

1 i. Mother's request that the Court calculate and order Father to pay support arrears
2 for the period 10/15/2023 – 3/15/2024 is denied without prejudice to a new
3 motion as this issue is not currently before the Court. The parties shall meet and
4 confer on this issue before either party files a motion on this issue.

5 d. Other Requests

6 i. Father's request that the Court order Mother to provide updated medical records
7 is denied without prejudice to all discovery avenues available to Father.

8 ii. Father's request that the Court order Mother to provide an updated note from her
9 doctor indicating if her inability to work is related to her cancer treatment and
10 why her doctor has put her off work for 10 weeks is without prejudice to all
11 discovery avenues available to Father.

12 iii. Father's request to subject Mother to an independent medical examination is
13 denied.

14 iv. Father's request to enter a seek work order for Mother effective July 1 (or set an
15 evidentiary hearing in the Fall) is reserved for the next hearing date.

16 v. Father's request that the Court confirm the San Diego condominium to him so he
17 can refinance the property (or bifurcate this issue and set it for an early trial on
18 the characterization and disposition of this asset) is denied without prejudice to a
19 new motion as this request is beyond the scope of the issues set to be heard on
20 4/16/2024.

21 e. Review Hearing

22 i. Mother's request to set the next review hearing on Tuesday, 7/2/2024 is denied.
23 The calendar is too impacted on that date for there to be time to add an additional
24 review hearing to that calendar.

25 ii. A review hearing is set for Tuesday, 7/16/2024 at 9:00 AM in Dept. 404 on the
26 following issues: (a) whether to retroactively modify child and temporary spousal
27 support for the period 3/16/2024 – 6/15/2024, (b) a Smith / Ostler order for the
28 period 10/15/2023 – 3/15/2024, (c) a Smith / Ostler order for the period
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1 3/16/2024 – 6/15/2024, (d) child and temporary spousal support effective
2 6/16/2024, and (e) whether to subject either party to a seek work order.

3 iii. At least 20 calendar days prior to the next hearing date, both parties shall file and
4 serve an updated Income and Expense Declaration.

5 iv. At least 20 calendar days prior to the next hearing date, Father shall file and serve
6 a declaration which contains: (a) a proposed bonus table for Smith / Ostler for the
7 periods 10/15/2023 – 3/15/2024 and 3/16/2024 – 6/15/2024, (b) a summary of his
8 total income (with documentary evidence in support) earned for the period
9 10/15/2023 – 3/15/2024, (c) a summary of his total income (with documentary
10 support) earned for the period 3/16/2024 – 6/14/2024. Father shall also outline
11 his position with respect to all other issues set to be heard on 7/16/2024.

12 v. At least 20 calendar days prior to the next hearing date, Mother shall file and
13 serve a declaration explaining why her disability payments stopped at the end of
14 March 2024, whether she remains eligible for disability payments during the new
15 placement “off work” commencing 4/2/2024, whether she has applied for
16 disability payments for this period, and whether any such application remains
17 pending or has been denied. Mother shall attach documentary evidence to support
18 her statements. Mother shall also outline her position with respect to all other
19 issues set to be heard on 7/16/2024.

20 vi. At least 10 calendar days prior to the next hearing date, each party shall file and
21 serve updated Statements of Support Calculation for the period 3/16/2024 –
22 6/15/2024 (if either party wishes to modify the current orders regarding this
23 period) and for the period 6/16/2024 and going forward.

24 f. Findings and Order After Hearing for the Prior 2/15/2024 Hearing Date

25 i. Father’s attorney shall prepare and submit to the Court the Findings and Order
26 After Hearing for the 2/15/2024 hearing date, as previously ordered, forthwith.

27 **B. Preparation of Order**

28 1) Father’s attorney shall prepare the order.
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1 2) **Preparation of Order:** If you are directed by the court to prepare the order after hearing – within
2 10 calendar days of the hearing you must either: (a) Serve the proposed order to the other
3 party/counsel for approval, and follow the procedures set forth in CA Rules of Court, Rule
4 5.125(c), or (b) If the other party did not appear or the matter was uncontested, submit the
5 proposed order after hearing directly to the court. Failure to submit the order after hearing within
6 10 days may allow the other party to prepare a proposed order and submit it to the court in
7 accordance with CA Rules of Court, Rule 5.125(d).
